BIO REMEMBERS: WALTER CRONKITE

TUESDAY, JULY 21ST AT 8PM ET / 7PM CT / 9PM PT

BIO Channel honors the life and work of “the most trusted man in America,” Walter Cronkite, who passed away last week at the age of 92. “Bio Remembers: Walter Cronkite” will celebrate the icon of American journalism who announced the assassination of President John F. Kennedy, the first time man landed on the moon, the Watergate scandal, the Civil Rights movement, the war in Vietnam and countless other moments in American history, on Tuesday, July 21st at 8PM ET/7PM CT/9PM PT.

As an ambitious young man raised by a single mom in St. Joseph, Missouri, Cronkite left college to pursue a career with the United Press, covering the Nuremberg Trials, World War II and Soviet Russia. He flew on a bombing mission with the U.S. Air Force, landed in North Africa with the U.S. Army, covered the Battle of the Bulge and in 1950 he caught the attention of media giant Edward R. Murrow who offered him a job with CBS's Washington affiliate delivering the nightly news broadcast and hosting programs like “You Are There.” By 1962 Walter Cronkite was the beloved anchorman of CBS Evening News, beating out the competition at other networks and coining his infamous closing line; “And that's the way it is.” a position that he filled until his retirement in 1982.

Through archival footage and interviews with family members, friends and colleagues, BIO Remembers the man who turned a less-than-pretty face, a unique style of delivery, and a simple catchphrase into one of the most storied careers in television, and he set the standard by which all television news people will be forever judged.
